QUALITATIVE STUDY ON MEDICAL SCHOOL SURGICAL EXPOSURE

My name is Dr. Eric Bortnick, and I am an Assistant Professor in the Department of Urology at Yale University.

I am conducting a qualitative study to better understand the medical school surgical experience. Specifically, we are seeking to assess the experiences, perspectives, and potential impact of medical school surgical training on the decision to go into a surgical residency program and how future experiences in a surgical residency do or do not align.

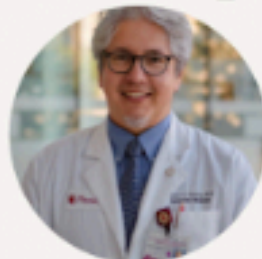
